## Opportunities for Volunteering with the FCLI

At Fordhall Farm, variety really is the spice of life. There are many different opportunities for volunteers to easily fit in with the working of the charity and farm business and for their input to be highly valued and significant.

Whatever the situation, all volunteers will be required to uphold health and safety guidance given to them during the induction. Volunteers are representatives of Fordhall Community Land Initiative and are expected to always do their utmost to promote Fordhall Organic Farm/Fordhall Community Land Initiative in its most positive light.

The different roles break down into five areas:

1. **Office Administration** – Jobs include data inputting on computers, filing paperwork, telephoning customers, marketing, stuffing newsletters etc. This work is immensely helpful in the smooth running of the office.
  - **What do we expect?** – Most volunteers come regularly once a week (Tues-Fri), others come whenever they have spare time or we have a particular need for extra hands. We try to encourage a more regular routine as it allows us to plan ahead more easily knowing the resources available. Whatever the situation, volunteers are discouraged from just showing up as there is no guarantee any staff or jobs will be available.
2. **Volunteer Weekends** – These weekends are held every 6-8 weeks and the tasks vary widely depending what is needed around the farm or if there are any upcoming events. There is **no** animal management involved. Volunteers can either attend one or both days at the weekend and camping facilities are available. There is no charge for the weekend, however, we do ask for a donation to help to cover food costs.
  - **What do we expect?** – It is absolutely essential that places are booked in advance for these weekends. If there is a need to cancel it is important to let us know as soon as possible so jobs can be reorganised. It is also essential that, if required, protective clothing is to be worn during specific tasks, as this removes any risk both to yourself and to others. We expect volunteers to arrive promptly in time for the induction; otherwise they may miss important information.
3. **Events** – Events are a key part to the Initiatives aims and success. They are an opportunity for the public to visit Fordhall Farm and see for themselves what we can offer. All events vary in scale and are held at throughout the year. Events vary both in size and audience; we hold family fun days, seasonal events and a family friendly festival. The role of a volunteer can vary from car parking to serving refreshments to running stalls. If a volunteer has a particular skill or idea they wish to pursue, events are an excellent opportunity for this.
  - **What do we expect?** – Volunteers need to let us know in advance if they are available for an event as this allows us to maximise their input and also increase the ‘man-power (or woman-power)’ we have available. Events are an opportunity for volunteers to work in shifts. Often there is an early set-up time, general activities during the day, then a clean-up time at the end of the day. Although most volunteers are present throughout, there are plenty of chances for others to provide ‘relief’ for a couple of

hours. It is important that we know in advance if volunteers are available so arrangements can be made accordingly.

4. **Arthur's Farm Kitchen Assistant** (subject to availability) – The tea room has been up and running since May 2010, it is a side arm of the Fordhall Community Land Initiative and helps to generate funds to continue in the running of the education programme. We serve delicious homemade meals created using local and/or organic produce.

- **What do we expect?** – We have some paid staff in the tearoom and kitchen, however, during busy times they can do with an extra pair of hands, either serving or clearing tables. Volunteering in the tearoom, means that you would be acting as the “face” of Fordhall that day, therefore, we would expect you to be approachable, presentable and friendly. No previous experience is necessary; however, if you have worked in catering before it would be a bonus!

5. **Remote** – It is often difficult to volunteer remotely but volunteers can provide Fordhall Community Land Initiative with cakes to be used either at events to raise funds, where volunteers run a cake stall on our behalf or for volunteer weekends. Both are immensely helpful as this is a time consuming process and could otherwise be costly for the Initiative.

Volunteers can also help with flyer distribution and promotion of events and courses – this can be incredibly helpful during busy periods!

- **What do we expect?** – We usually ask for cakes to be made using local or organic ingredients if possible, but do not expect volunteers to go out of their way to accommodate this. A list of ingredients is required, particularly concerning any allergens (nuts/gluten etc). Ideally, cakes will be brought to the farm either the day before an event or working weekend or on the actual day. If bringing cakes in between events it is helpful to phone ahead to ensure we have sufficient freezer space. It is important that we know in advance what volume to expect, particularly regarding the volunteer weekends, so we can plan around this. At events, cakes are sold by the slice and all proceeds are donated to be reinvested in the Initiative for future projects. More cakes means more funds raised! This is an easy, non-committal way of people volunteering from the comfort of their homes while still making a huge difference to the success of the Initiative. For volunteering with the flyer distribution, we would ask that volunteers collect flyers/posters from us and distribute them to local shops, schools, community centres, social venues etc...

### **Refreshments**

- Tea and coffee is provided free of charge in the office or portacabin. If you are volunteering over lunchtime, then please bring a packed lunch. You can of course eat in the tearoom too – please see below for more details.
- As a way of saying thank you for the valuable time that you give us, we offer our volunteers a 50% discount in the tearoom from anything on the menu, on the day they are volunteering. You can get a discount card from Becca – just ask!

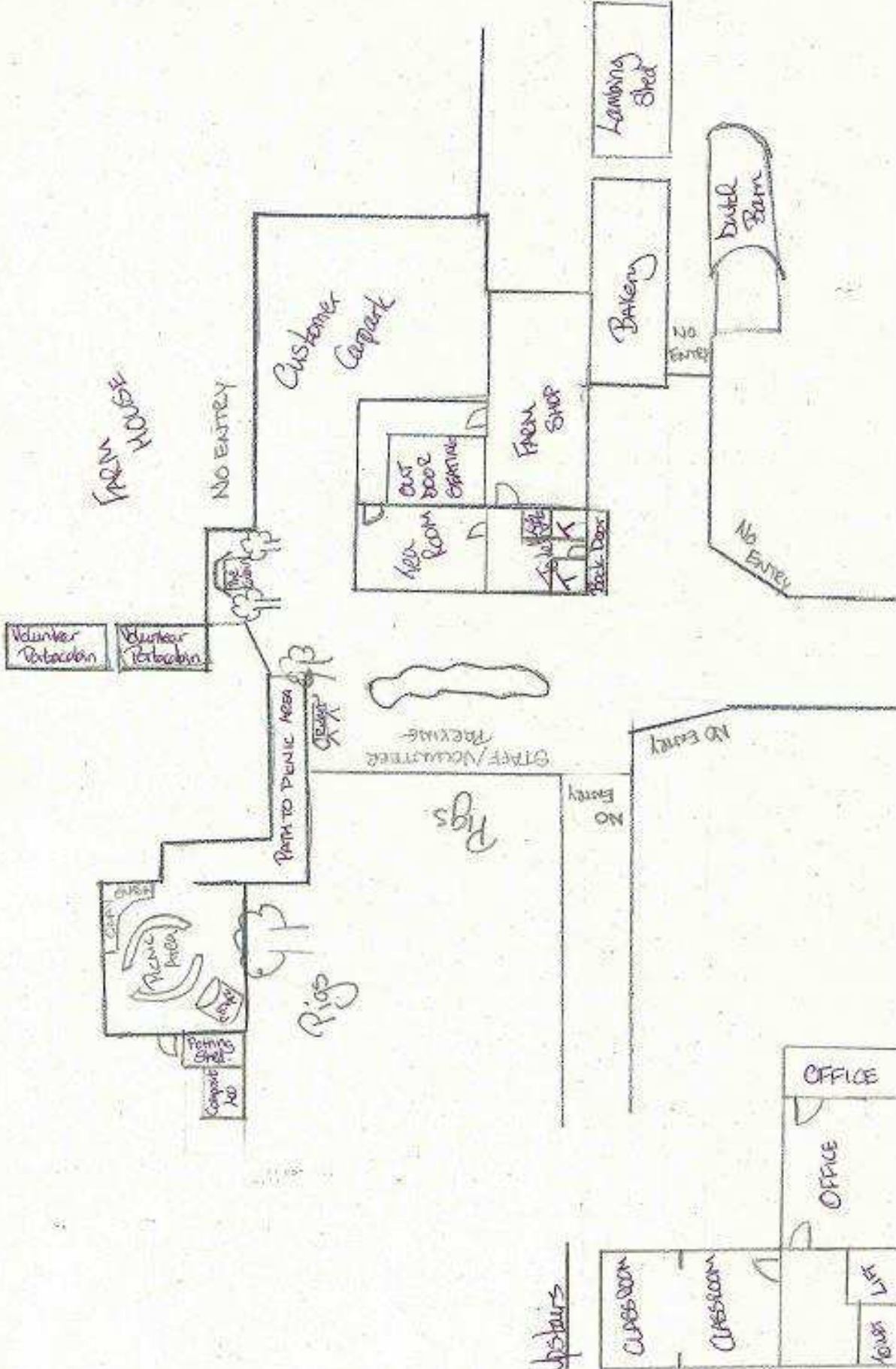
### **Expenses**

- We will repay any expenses for items purchased for the FCLI paid for by you when you provide a valid receipt.
- We can repay travel expenses, if you wish to claim them.
  - Car mileage can be claimed at 40p/mile
  - Public transport can be claimed for standard class travel along with a valid receipt/ticket
  - Taxi fares can be claimed along with a valid receipt
- If you decide not to claim the travel expenses, you can choose to donate them to the FCLI, which can also be Gift Aided. Should you choose this option, please fill in the travel expenses form and sign the declaration at the top. The FCLI will then seek to recover 25% of the donation from the HMRC – give more at no extra cost to you! ☺

### **Monitoring, procedures and evaluation**

- At the end of your day at Fordhall, please sign the Volunteer Hours sheet. These hours help us to keep track of the valuable time volunteers spend with us; they can also be used to help us when applying for funding. The sheet is situated on the Volunteer's Shelf in the office.
- Information about all volunteers will be kept confidential and in accordance with data protection legislation and will be accessible only to those involved with the support of the volunteers. Anyone volunteering in the office will be asked to sign a confidentiality agreement.
- The FCLI tries hard to ensure that all volunteers have an enjoyable experience in all volunteer roles. Please be aware that you may be working closely with other volunteers who may have different needs and sensitivities to you.
- The FCLI's disciplinary procedures manage misconduct, these procedures are in place to help and encourage you to achieve and maintain standards of conduct and performance.
- Should you have any grievances relating to your role as a volunteer, the FCLI would hope that you feel comfortable to discuss this with your Volunteer Manager (Becca Cartwright). If you feel you need to discuss the issue with a higher authority, please feel free to talk to FCLI Manager Charlotte Hollins.
- If you continuously volunteer at Fordhall over a 6 month period, Becca will do an informal appraisal with you, this is just to make sure that you are happy in your position here and to find out if we need to make any changes.
